Reginald Blaber, MD

Executive Vice President & Chief Clinical Officer, Virtua Health

Reginald Blaber is Virtua's Executive Vice President and Chief Clinical Officer. His responsibilities include providing strategic direction, leadership and accountability for all physician services, and for setting the standards for the highest level of quality and safety throughout Virtua—consistent with our mission and vision. He also serves as liaison between the medical staff, administration and board of trustees. Prior to joining Virtua's executive team, Dr. Blaber was President of Lourdes Health System. He created the Lourdes Cardiovascular Institute where he led more than 80 employed and affiliated cardiologists, growing the service to become the largest heart program in southern New Jersey. In addition, he created a culture of quality and innovation—resulting in multiple awards for excellence. These include national quality recognition for cardiovascular care and cardiac surgery by leading, independent ratings organizations such as Healthgrades, Becker's and Truven Health Analytics. Dr. Blaber is a practicing cardiologist who has been affiliated with Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital in Camden (formerly Our Lady of Lourdes Medical Center) for more than 20 years. There he participated in numerous clinical and

administrative committees, including a term as Medical Staff President. In 2010, he was named President of Lourdes Medical Associates and, in 2011, President of Lourdes Cardiology Services. In 2016, he was appointed to the New Jersey Cardiovascular Health Advisory Panel. The same year, the Diocese of Camden honored him with the Saint Luke Award for Leadership in Catholic Health Care in southern New Jersey. He has served on the boards of The Joseph Fund, the Haddonfield Ambulance Association, the Interfaith Care Givers of Haddonfield, and the Bucknell University Alumni Association. Dr. Blaber came to South Jersey by way of Walter Reed Army Medical Center, Fort Benning, and Fort Meade. He served six years in the U.S. Army as an internist and achieved the rank of major. He received his medical degree from Hahnemann University School of Medicine, where he completed a fellowship in cardiovascular disease. He graduated from Bucknell University with a Bachelor of Science in chemistry and earned a Master of Business Administration from Villanova University.



John F. Bonamo, MD. MS, FACOG, FACPE
Executive Vice President and Chief Medical and Quality Officer, RWJBarnabas Health

As Executive Vice President and Chief Medical and Quality Officer of RWJBarnabas Health, Dr. John F. Bonamo leads the System's journey as a high reliability organization, an initiative to secure top-tier clinical outcomes and deliver the highest quality care and safest experience for patients and the RWJBarnabas Health workforce. He has served as the System's leading authority on all aspects of the COVID pandemic. Dr. Bonamo is an exceptional physician executive with a distinguished clinical background in obstetrics and gynecology and a proven track record of excellence in hospital leadership. He assumed his position in 2015, having served as President and CEO of Saint Barnabas Medical Center (SBMC), now Cooperman Barnabas Medical Center.

He joined SBMC's medical staff after completing his residency in 1981. Dr. Bonamo is a Fellow of the American College of Healthcare Executives, and the American Board of Obstetricians and Gynecologists and is a member of the New Jersey Obstetrical and Gynecological Society. He is board certified by the American Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology and holds an MD from the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey and a Master of Science in Health Care Management from Harvard's School of Public Health. Since 2006, Dr. Bonamo has been a faculty member of the Beijing University International

Management Program, teaching in the U.S. and China. He serves as visiting Professor at the University of Beijing Master's Program for hospital management.



Carl Kirton, DNO, MBA, RN, ANP
Chief Nursing Officer, University Hospital

Dr. Carl Kirton has more than 30 years of professional practice as a registered nurse and advanced practice nurse with an expertise in HIV and AIDS. Dr. Kirton is an accomplished educator holding an adjunct appointment on the faculty at New York University where he currently teaches at the master's and clinical doctorate level. He has published several books on the topic of HIV/AIDS and have author or co-authored more than 50 articles in various publications including many referred journals. Dr. Kirton is the Associate Editors for the *Journal of the Association of Nurses in AIDS Care and* the Associate Editor for *Annals of LGBTQ Public and Population Health*. Dr. Kirton has more than 20 years serving in senior level positions at both outpatient and inpatient service lines. Currently, he is the Chief Nursing Officer at University Hospital in Newark, NJ where he was instrumental in organizing this facility's response and recovery during the COVID epidemic.



Lewis Rubinson, M.D., Ph.D., FCCP Chief Medical Officer, Morristown Medical Center, Atlantic Health System

Lewis Rubinson, M.D., PhD. is the Chief Medical Officer at Morristown Medical Center (MMC), a 735 bed referral medical center within the Atlantic Health System. He has been the physician executive for the clinical response to the COVID-19 pandemic at MMC. In Spring of 2020, MMC had 20 COVID-19

inpatient units (9 ICUs and 11 non-critical care units) caring for a peak of 315 hospitalized patients with COVID-19. By Winter of 2022 MMC had cared for nearly 5000 inpatients with COVID-19 associated illness and the Atlantic Health System had cared for more than 12000 inpatients.

Dr. Rubinson has a passion for integrating clinical technology, best practice clinical workflows together with data and analytics to improve strategic hospital clinical challenges. He is an expert in resuscitation, high risk patient transport, critical care and emergency operations. Prior to joining Atlantic Health, he was Professor of Medicine for the Program in Trauma at the University of Maryland School of Medicine, a unique program dedicated to improving the care of patients with traumatic injuries and critical illness. There he served as Vice President, Deputy Chief Clinical Officer at the University of Maryland Medical Center (UMMC).

Among Dr. Rubinson's many leadership roles, he has served as Disaster Medicine Director for Public Health Seattle King County and Chief Medical Officer (Acting) of the Health and Human Services' National Disaster Medical System (NDMS). At NDMS, he was the federal Chief Medical Officer in the HHS Secretary's Operation Center for major events such as Superstorm Sandy, the Republican and Democratic National Conventions and President Obama's second-term inauguration.

Dr. Rubinson earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Michigan. He received his medical degree from Northwestern University Medical School and completed his residency in Internal Medicine at the University of California, San Francisco. While pursuing his fellowship in Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine, Dr. Rubinson also received a Ph.D. in Clinical Investigation from the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health.



Elizabeth Sheridan, RN, BSN, MA, NEA-BC, FACHE Regional Chief Administrative Officer, Inspira Health System

Serving in leadership roles at several New Jersey health systems, Sheridan joined (what would become) Inspira Health in 1999 as administrator for its hospital in Bridgeton, and the system's Chief Nurse Executive. Today, she is Inspira's Regional Chief Administrative Officer for its hospitals in Elmer and Vineland, and a large multi-service health center in Bridgeton.

At Inspira, Sheridan has overseen the development of dozens of projects and programs. Medical and nursing residencies; multi-million-dollar construction projects, oncology, neonatal, surgical, clinical research, senior emergency services have all flourished under her leadership.

Sheridan has nurtured a culture of excellence that has led to nearly every patient care unit being nationally recognized for excellence. Her mentorship has encouraged Inspira's nurses to undertake projects and original research that have garnered local and national recognition.

In 2008, Inspira became the first in New Jersey to have three facilities earn Magnet Designation at one time. As a testament to her leadership, all three centers have maintained Magnet designation to this day. Only 3 percent of hospitals internationally have maintained designation for this length of time. Additionally, Inspira Medical Center Vineland was named a Leapfrog Top Teaching Hospital in 2017. Inspira Medical Center Elmer received the Women's Choice Award as One of America's Best Hospitals for Orthopedics in 2019, 2020 and 2021; the Women's Choice Award as One of America's Best Hospitals Obstetrics in 2019, 2020, and 2021 and Women's Choice Award as One of America's Best Hospitals for Women's Imaging Center at Vineland in 2020 and 2021. Greater Philadelphia Business Coalition on Health (GPBCH) Hospital Quality & Safety Award.

Amid the pandemic, Sheridan has advocated for staff safety and patient well-being, regularly visiting patient care units to assess evolving needs, check up on her teams and encourage vaccination. She also oversaw the opening of satellite ICUs and the cross-training of re-deployed staff while fostering an environment based on mutual support and resilience. Beyond the walls of Inspira, Sheridan coordinated partnerships and programs to ensure vaccinations were available to the most vulnerable in the community. Her visionary leadership also propelled Inspira's Clinical Research team to study groundbreaking COVID-19 therapies.

For her decades of compassionate patient-centric leadership, Sheridan has earned regional and national awards, including: The College of New Jersey's Distinguished Alumni Humanitarian Award; the Garden State Woman of the Year for Healthcare; Organization of Nurse Executives of NJ (ONE-NJ) Professional Recognition Award; and Nursing Spectrum's Giving Excellence Meaning (GEM) Award for the Philadelphia Tri-State region. Listed as Top 130 Women Healthcare Executives in U.S. to Know by Becker's Hospital Review; recently inducted into the Cumberland County Women's Hall of Fame.

Sheridan has achieved Fellow status in American College of Healthcare Executives and has volunteered to serve in leadership and board positions. Currently Chairperson of the Nurse Executive Constituency Group of New Jersey and HRET Board member with the New Jersey Hospital Association and Community Foodbank of South Jersey board member. Past president of the Organization of Nurse Leaders of New Jersey.

President of Population Health, Hackensack Meridian Health Network

Mark D. Sparta, PT, MPA, FACHE, is currently the president and chief hospital executive of Hackensack Meridian's flagship hospital, Hackensack University Medical Center and serves as executive vice president of Population Health of the Hackensack Meridian Health network. Mr. Sparta assumed the roles of president and CHE in 2018 after serving as executive vice president and chief operating officer at Hackensack University Medical Center. From November 2014 to June 2015, he served as acting CEO of Hackensack Meridian Health Pascack Valley Medical Center.

As the President of a \$2 billion organization, Mark heads the 781-bed research and teaching hospital with over 8,000 active employees, over 1,600 physicians, currently ranking #1 in New Jersey and among the top 1 percent of all hospitals in the nation – continuing to set a high bar for New Jersey hospitals. President and CEO, Rutgers Health University Behavioral Health Care

Frank A. Ghinassi, PhD, ABPP is President and CEO for Rutgers Health University Behavioral Health Care (UBHC). As CEO, he is responsible for a statewide system of academically based mental health and addiction services across New Jersey, and overseeing 2,200 staff and faculty. UBHC, one of the largest providers of behavioral and addictions healthcare in the country, offers a wide range of clinical services across all diagnosis, and across the lifespan, including inpatient units, partial hospitalization programs, intensive outpatient programming, case management, traditional outpatient treatment, correctional health care, a Certified Community Behavioral Health Center, peer operated helplines for service members, veterans, mothers of children with special needs, law enforcement officers and child protection workers, a statewide suicide prevention hotline and a clinical research and training institute, as well as an array of specialty and peer support services. Dr. Ghinassi is a Professor at Rutgers Graduate School of Applied and Professional Psychology; an Adjunct Professor of Psychiatry at Rutgers Robert Wood Johnson Medical School; an Adjunct Associate Professor of Psychiatry at the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine; and a Core Faculty Member at Rutgers Global Health Institute.

Additionally, Dr. Ghinassi has been appointed as senior vice president of Behavioral Health and Addictions Service Line at RWJBarnabas Health. In this new role, he will strategically direct behavioral health and addictions, fostering synergies between Rutgers Health and RWJBarnabas to enhance high-quality, fully-integrated and interdisciplinary care throughout New Jersey.

Prior to joining UBHC, Dr. Ghinassi was the Vice President for Quality, Patient Safety, Regulatory Compliance and Health Information Management at Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic of the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center Presbyterian Shadyside, where he was a member of the Executive Management Group. Dr. Ghinassi also functioned as an Associate Professor of Psychiatry at the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine where he was actively involved in the training of Psychiatric Residents and Doctoral Psychology Interns.

In previous positions, he served as Director of Mood and Anxiety Partial Hospitalization and Residential Services at McLean Hospital/Harvard Medical School. While in Boston, he was also an Instructor in Psychology in the Department of Psychiatry at Harvard Medical School and was actively involved in the training of Pre- and PostDoctoral Psychology Interns and Fellows.

As a frequent invited presenter at national professional meetings and conferences, Dr. Ghinassi has been an active member on SAMHSA planning committees, CMS commissioned technical expert panels, and acted as chairman of the Performance Measurement Committee of the National Association of Behavioral Healthcare (previously the National Association of Psychiatric Health Systems), where he was the 2007 recipient of the National Quality Award, recognized for his leadership on key projects, committees and expert panels aimed at improving the measurement and delivery of behavioral healthcare. Dr. Ghinassi is also the co-chair of the Addiction Treatment Quality Workgroup for the National Association of Behavioral Healthcare.

From 2003 to 2016, Dr. Ghinassi has served as a Player Development Educator and Evaluator for the National Football League and as a psychologist for the Pittsburgh Steelers, the Pittsburgh Penguins and for a number of local college and university departments of athletics. He has also long served as a member of the Adjunct Faculty at the Center for Creative Leadership, an international institute for the enhancement of corporate leadership and executive coaching.



Russ Micoli, MHA
Vice President, Behavioral Health Services, Virtua Health

Russ has spent his 30+ year career as a leader in the behavioral health system in South Jersey. Russ is presently working at Virtua Health as the Vice President of Behavioral Health Services, where he is leading strategic planning and business development efforts for the new Behavioral Health Service Line. In his time at Virtua the Behavioral Health has seen steady growth in both patient volume and contribution margin. Additionally, Virtua launched its first-ever Behavioral Health Practice, where Medication for Addictions Treatment (MAT) and mental health and substance use therapies are provided. Russ was recently selected to Co-Chair Virtua' Violence Prevention Steering Committee. Before joining Virtua Health in August of 2019, Russ was with Jefferson Health, New Jersey as the Vice President for Ambulatory & Behavioral Health Services. While at Jefferson in 1989, Russ opened the first hospital-based Children's Crisis Intervention Inpatient Unit in South Jersey and led efforts to expand the child, adolescent and adult services during his time there. Russ is one of the founding members of the South Jersey Behavioral Health Innovation Collaborative and served as the first Chairperson of this group. Russ is an active member and past Chair of the New Jersey Hospital Association Behavioral Health Constituency Group, where he has worked on a number of regional and statewide committees.



Donald J. Parker, LCSW

President, Behavioral Health Care Transformation Services, Hackensack Meridian Health

Donald J. Parker, a licensed clinical social worker, is president, Behavioral Health Care Transformation Services/Integrative Medicine, for Hackensack Meridian Health, which includes five hospital based general Psychiatric Services in eleven hospitals and multiple Outpatient Services. He also served as president of Carrier Clinic. Carrier Clinic operates an acute care mental health hospital, a residential treatment center for adolescents, a fully accredited special needs school for students grades 7 through 12, the Blake Recovery Center, an inpatient unit focused on addiction recovery, and The Retreat & Recovery At Ramapo Valley in Mahwah, N.J., an outpatient unit focused on addiction recovery that opened in February of this year.

Prior to joining Carrier Clinic in 2013, Parker served as the vice president for physician services and ambulatory care at St. Joseph's Health System, Paterson, N.J. Previously, Parker also served as president/CEO of Atlantic Mental Health for 15 years and subsequently merged into the AtlantiCare Health System. At AtlantiCare, he served in multiple leadership roles, including vice president of business development and president of AtlantiCare Health Services, where he developed and provided leadership to more than 20 ambulatory businesses with 42 locations. Parker's capstone achievement at AtlantiCare was his participation on the leadership team of the Health System as it earned and was awarded the Malcolm Baldrige Award, a Presidential recognition for quality and achievement.

Parker serves as the Chairman of the National Association of Psychiatric Health Systems Foundation, New Jersey Hospital Association, the Somerset County Business Partnership, and for 15 years on the Atlantic Cape Community College board of trustees. He also has served on numerous public and private boards, chairing the New Jersey Association of Mental Health Center's panel for two terms, serving as a founding member and chair of Gilda's Club of South Jersey, and chairing the New Jersey Supreme Court Committee responsible for rewriting divorce regulations for the state. He was recently honored by the Boy Scouts of America with The Toast of Scouting Award, presented for outstanding community service and leadership. Parker has also been recognized by ROI-NJ as a top Influencer in Health Care in New Jersey for the last five years.



Aakash Shah, MD, MBA, MSc White House Fellow, Department of Health and Human Services

Dr. Aakash Shah is currently serving as a White House Fellow in the Immediate Office of the Secretary at the United States Department of Health and Human Services where his portfolio includes mental health, overdose prevention, and criminal justice reform. He is also a practicing emergency room doctor who specializes in addiction and behavioral health. During the first wave of the pandemic, he helped care for the first confirmed cases of COVID-19 in New Jersey and assisted nonprofits in adapting their operations to the pandemic.

Prior to his current role, Aakash served as the Director of Addiction Medicine and the Medical Director of Project HEAL (a community violence intervention program) at Jersey Shore University Medical Center (JSUMC) as well as the Medical Director of New Jersey Reentry Corporation (NJRC). In those roles, he helped build programs that reimagined the criminal justice system through a rehabilitative lens. He raised \$7.5 million dollars in federal, state, and philanthropic grant funding over two years for such programs and his work resulted in several statewide reforms (including the elimination of prior authorization requirements for medications for opioid use disorder) that received the bipartisan endorsement of five former New Jersey Governors, several local editorial boards, and major healthcare systems.

Prior to his work with HMH and NJRC, Aakash was the Founder and Executive Director of Be Jersey Strong, which trained students to serve as community health workers. During the third open enrollment period, Be Jersey Strong recruited over 500 students – two-thirds of whom spoke a second language with over 50 languages represented – from over 20 campuses to help inform New Jerseyans of their options for coverage. The initiative represented one of the largest and most diverse efforts to connect the uninsured to coverage in the nation and was honored by then President Barack Obama at the White House for its impact.

Aakash has assisted the Biden-Sanders Unity Task Force on Healthcare, staffed the health policy transition committee for Governor Phil Murphy of New Jersey, served on the health policy councils of three gubernatorial campaigns, and advised the New Jersey Senate Majority Leader and members of the United States House of Representatives. In these roles, his portfolio has included initiatives to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic, combat the opioid crisis, determine the health impact of burn pit exposure

during military service, expand paid family leave, secure financing for women's health, establish Medicaid Accountable Care Organizations (ACOs), and implement the Affordable Care Act (ACA).

President and Chief Executive Officer, Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital
President, Southern Region, RWJBarnabas Health

Bill Arnold, MHA, is the President and Chief Executive Officer of Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital in New Brunswick, and President of the Southern Region for RWJBarnabas Health (RWJBH), which spans Monmouth and Ocean Counties. Mr. Arnold has held leadership roles with RWJBH since joining the system in 1994. Prior to his promotion to regional leadership in 2019, he served as President and CEO of Monmouth Medical Center (MMC) and The Unterberg Children's Hospital since April 2016 and as Chief Operating Officer of MMC since 2006. He joined Monmouth Medical Center in 1998 as Administrative Director of Operations and was promoted to Vice President of Operations in 1999. Before joining MMC, he served as Operations Manager with Saint Barnabas Medical Center, Livingston, and Administrative Director of Operations for Barnabas Health, which he has served in various capacities since 1994.

Mr. Arnold earned a B.S from Stetson University, FL, and an M.H.A. from Seton Hall University, South Orange. Bill is a member of New Jersey Hospital Association (NJHA) Board of Trustees, serving as 2021 Secretary in addition to Chair of the Audit and Compliance Committee. He is also a member of the NJHA Executive, Finance and Investment Committees, as well as the Chairman's Advisory Committee on Industry Direction. Shereef Elnahal, MD, MBAPresident and Chief Executive Officer, University Hospital

Dr. Shereef Elnahal is the President and Chief Executive Officer of University Hospital in Newark, NJ- a Level I trauma center, the principal academic medical center for Rutgers NJ Medical School, the state's only public hospital, and New Jersey's largest, urban safety net hospital. He has served in the role since the summer of 2019. Prior to his time at University Hospital, Elnahal served as New Jersey's 21st Health Commissioner, appointed to the Cabinet post by Governor Murphy and confirmed by the New Jersey Senate, serving during the first two years of the Murphy administration.

Elnahal has led University Hospital throughthe COVID-19 public health emergency. The hospital has served as a model for urban hospital and regional response efforts, developing protocols for expanding capacity, maintaining PPE supplies, adapting clinical protocols in accordance with the latest evidence, and conducting clinical trials and research. In addition, Governor Phil Murphy tasked the hospital with coordinating regional pandemic response efforts across dozens of hospitals in northern NJ, as well as activating a military field hospital alongside the National Guard to create additional capacity in the face of the surge.

Elnahal also brought his public health background to bear in leading University Hospital through a new vision for the state's only public hospital. He has focused on building coalitions to improve the organization's standing in the Newark community, and has embraced the hospital's legacy as an anchor institution with an obligation first and foremost to the city's residents under the Newark Accords. He has placed significant focus on improving the hospital's performance in quality and safety, restructuring to an evidence-based quality management approach that is quickly reducing infection rates and other adverse outcomes.

During his time as Commissioner, Elnahal left a lasting impact on the State's healthcare system. He expanded the New Jersey Health Information Network, a shared services platform that provides the infrastructure for electronic exchange of patient health information among healthcare providers. He worked closely with New Jersey First Lady Tammy Murphy on her Nurture NJ campaign to help improve infant and maternal health outcomes and reduce health disparities — a mission he has continued at University Hospital, with its top tier maternal health practices. He more than doubled the number of patients and physicians participating in the State's Medicinal Marijuana Program. Finally, he made strides with advancing the Governor's agenda in the opioid epidemic, granting funding to institutions to facilitate

electronic health records, data sharing, and public health reporting, and marked NJ as the first state in the nation to allow paramedics to use buprenorphine in the field.

Before his public service in New Jersey, Elnahal served in the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs in the Obama Administration. He was initially appointed as a White House Fellow under Secretary Bob McDonald, spearheading then- Under Secretary for Health David Shulkin's initiative to identify and spread best practices across the Veterans Health Administration. He was then hired on as the Assistant Deputy Under Secretary for Health for Quality, Safety, and Value, serving as the chief quality and patient safety officer for the largest health system in the United States.

Elnahal holds an MD from Harvard Medical School and an MBA with Distinction from Harvard Business School, and lives with his wife and three children in New Jersey.

Amy B. Mansue was appointed President and Chief Executive Officer of Inspira Health in August 2020. She has dedicated nearly three decades of service to the health care industry, and has made a significant impact across the state, having worked both in politics and for leading hospitals in New Jersey.
